Minutes March 29, 2016

The Board met and reviewed payroll, accounts payable and signed the register. The Selectmen reviewed and signed the recreation register.

Jonathan Ellis was in to present the weekly Treasurer's report. Please see last page to view report.

Bryan made a motion, 2nd by Mantegari to approve the minutes of 3/22/16 as written. All were in favor.

Kip Kaiser, Building Inspector, had the following permits to be signed this week:

- Chris Ferris, 24 Mill Pond Road, generator: signed by Board
- Ryan Sullivan, 35 Northrup Drive, mini split: signed by Board
- Wellner Poppe, 304 Middle Road, plumbing permit: signed by Board.

Chief Robinson, Lt. Roy, Sgt. Wood, Officer Abele, Chief Connell (East Kingston), and Officer Armstrong (former handler for Titan) were present to discuss the K9 program. Wood said he spoke with officers in 4 different departments to gain more information on Titan. Armstrong explained Titan's history of training, bites, and apprehensions. He said Titan is a food reward dog and came off the road late October when Armstrong tendered his resignation with the Laconia police department. Chief Connell said Titan is a fantastic working dog. Artimovich said he was in support of the K9 program but did not think this was the dog for Brentwood. He would like more of a community dog. Artimovich said that because this dog is already trained and certified, he was concerned that Abele would always be working to "catch up" to the dog. Abele said he has drive, motivation, and is 110% committed to this department and will put in the time to make this successful. Connell said with a K9 program, documentation was key and that Abele would be required to maintain a daily log including applicable training. Roy said this is not costing the Town upfront; if it does not work out the only thing lost is Abele's time. Bryan said he is in support of the program but wants to maintain good communication. He does not want to find out 6-8 months down the road that there have been problems and the program is not working out. He wants the board to be "in the loop" at all times. Bryan made a motion, 2nd by Menter to approve the K9 program and adopt Titan. The motion carried with Artimovich opposed.

Clement said the cost of recycling bins has increased and she would like to increase the fee charged \$1.00 to \$8.00 to cover the cost of labor to pick up the bins. Artimovich made a motion, 2nd by Christiansen to increase the fee for recycling bins to \$8.00. All were in favor.

Artimovich made a motion, 2nd by Mantegari to deny one veteran's credit and approve 7 others per RSA 72:28 and 72:35. All were in favor.
