A small group of residents gathered at the Town Hall on December 14th to discuss the fate of the *Brentwood Newsletter*. The team that spearheaded production for many years has finally decided to step back. Now the question has become: *Is the Newsletter valuable enough to town residents to ask a new team to volunteer the effort and man-hours needed to continue its publication?* We do not want to commit the time and resources needed to publish the *Newsletter* if only a few recipients read it.

We included a survey in the November issue, asking your opinion. Although the survey results that came back were highly in favor of keeping the print version going, only 4% of readers responded. Kindergarten

In January, we welcome students back to school. Our focus is nonfiction for both Reader's and Writer's Workshop. In Reader's Workshop, we are reading lots of nonfiction books about animals, and looking for important facts. In Writer's Workshop, students are learning ways to make their writing easier to read to others and teaching others what they know about animals. The science curriculum is integrated into reading and writing, as students learn about animals and adaptations. Math instruction will focus on place value for teens, solving word problems, and continuing to build number sense. Students will be introduced to the symbols for addition, subtraction, and equality.

Grade 1

This month first grade will be spending time writing about our ancestors and the countries they came to America from for our heritage project. First graders are also working on a character unit in reader's workshop. During this unit, we will challenge ourselves to think more deeply about the characters in our books. We will be looking closely at character actions, feelings, likes, and dislikes, and discuss how characters sometimes change. Lastly, we will attempt to better understand the characters in our books by making comparisons between the character's life and our own lives and thinking about why characters say and do certain things. In math, we are continuing to practice addition and subtraction word problems. We have been using organizers and diagrams as a tool to help us solve the word problems. Next, we will begin measurement using nonstandard units. Lastly, first grade is collecting donations to support the NH SPCA!

Grade 2

Second graders have been busy traveling around the world exploring maps, oceans and the seven continents. Now that we know where we are on a map, we will learn where many of our Christmas traditions come from as we head into our Holidays Around the World unit of study. Our study will include STEM activities, crafts, comparing and contrasting, reading and writing and caroling for Brentwood's seniors at both the Brentwood Rec Center and the Rockingham Nursing Home. Our study will conclude with a trip to The Children's Hands On Museum for their Celebrations Around the World program. In addition to all of this we managed to participate in the global One Hour of Code where we learned how to write code for computer games! As busy as we are it is important for us to keep an eye on the time so we are learning to tell time during our math block. One thing we know for certain, it's time to wish you all a Happy Holiday Season!

Library

Many thanks to all of the families and volunteers who supported our annual Fall Scholastic book fair. We had a smooth process, a great turn-out, and we look forward to our spring fair. Grades K-3 have finished reading the ten Ladybug Picture Book nominees for 2017, and all have cast their votes. Drumroll please... our school winner is Woodpecker Wants a Waffle by Steve Breen! Stay tuned for the announcement of the state winner.

Grades 4 and 5 have been working on becoming responsible digital citizens. Like earning a NH driver's license, we start out with some restrictions on our school-only book sharing social media site, Destiny Quest. Once we've proven that we can make safe and respectful choices, we will gain more freedom with less teacher oversight to interact with our classmates about our reading lives. Grades 4 and 5 have also been busy making their way through many of the Great Stone Face books. Ms. Bixby's Last Day by John David Anderson is our chosen read-aloud from the 2017 nominees list, which we use to reinforce literacy skills.

We M O V E in Physical Education by Mrs. Lane

Welcome. Jump Rope Club has exploded! We have a record number of students. It is very exciting. The fifth graders are really stepping up to be leaders helping to demonstrate to the younger students. It is amazing to be in the room with such positive energy and work at skills. This year grades 3-4-5 played a short handle game called pickleball which is similar to tennis or ping pong. It was fun to use our racket skills in a new lifetime activity. The 5th graders had a mini tournament to culminate the end of the unit and it was a good way to celebrate good skills and sportsmanship. I will bring back pickleball again during the year as it was very well received. Lifetime activities are so important for our students to be healthy both physically and mentally. In December students are moving to dance patterns in contemporary, multi-cultural and square dance formations. We will end the year with cooperative fitness games. It is really a lively time in the gym.

In January we will be dribbling with the hands, fitness testing and hopefully, snowshoeing. Have a wonderful Holiday season.
