

# Recycling in Brentwood

The Town of Brentwood collects single stream recycling at the curb every other week on the same day as your trash. It is important for residents to recycle as much material as possible, because if the amount of material that goes to the land fill is reduced, tax dollars are saved, and we will have a more environmentally responsible Town.

Our Single Stream Program makes recycling at home easier than ever! All recyclable material - office paper, plastics, tin cans, newspapers, cardboard - all go in the same bin. Residents may purchase 14-gallon recycling bins at the Town Offices for \$7.00 per bin. You may also use any rigid container, such as a laundry basket, for curbside collection, provided it is clearly marked as "recycling." **There is NO LIMIT to the number of recycling containers you can place at the curb each week!**



## PLEASE NO:

- plastic bags
- garbage
- yard waste
- ceramics or dishes
- motor oil containers
- styrofoam of any kind  
(ie: packing material, coffee cups, meat trays)
- hazardous waste
- light bulbs
- plate glass

## What can go in the bin?

### PAPER

- Newspaper / Magazines
- Paperback books
- Egg cartons
- Cup travel trays
- Mixed and/or shredded office paper
- Junk mail (plastic window okay)
  - Corrugated cardboard
  - Boxboard/Paperboard  
(i.e. cereal boxes, free of plastic & wax lining)

### PREPARATION:

- Shredded paper must be confined in a paper bag.
- Cardboard must be clean and bundled no larger than 2' x 2' x 2'.

### NON-PAPER

- All plastic containers #1-#7  
(i.e. beverage containers, tubs, laundry detergent containers, etc.)
- Glass containers used for foods and beverages ONLY (any color)
- Aluminum, tin, and steel cans
  - Metal lids to jars or bottles
- Aluminum foil, disposable pie tins, & aluminum baking trays

### PREPARATION:

- All recyclables should be rinsed free of residue. Labels may remain.
- Glass should be unbroken.
