

The Brentwood Conservation Commission is seeking interested applicants to fill 2 positions for an alternate role on the Commission.

The Brentwood Conservation Commission was established at the March 1967 Town Meeting, in accordance with New Hampshire RSA Title III, Chapter 36-A, to assist in protecting the natural resources of the town. The Commission advises and makes recommendations to the Select Board for the protection, development and proper utilization of local natural resources and open space. The Conservation Commission advises the Planning Board and Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA), as well as the NH Department of Environmental Services Wetlands Bureau (NH DES). The Conservation Commission meets regularly the second Wednesday of the month.

Interested applicants should have: an interest in conservation and the protection of natural resources in town; attend monthly meetings; exhibit a willingness and ability to actively give time and energy to the Commission's work and projects; must be a resident of Brentwood to serve. The Commission seeks a balance of talents, experience and skills that can be helpful to the Commission's work such as: foresters, farmers, hunters, fishermen, botanists, gardeners, biologists, soil scientists, hydrologists, engineers, attorneys, writers, and educators.

The alternate's term of service will be three (3) years, or the unexpired portion of a term in the case of the resignation of a member.
